Pastor Jack's Corner

October 2018

"I am the true vine and you are the branches...If you remain in me you will bear much fruit. (John 15)" Wow, October already? It seems as though we just started the summer season and now we are closing in on Halloween, Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas. Kids, and some adults, have returned to school, some are making plans to trek south for the winter...in fact some have already departed. We are all adjusting to the no-longer-summer schedule. I know many of you can relate to this but is seems to me as though the older I get the more swiftly the years pass.

Thanks to Chuck and Carol Walter for another **great hayride and picni**c. It was a great day, with lots of fun and folks. Although I was unable to attend I have heard a lot of great things, also, about the Acme Fall Festival...looking forward to it next year.

On Sunday, September 23, we had our annual Charge/Church Conference at Merritt UMC. I was so pleased by the turnout from our parish. We had, I believe, 17 folks come. We met with people from nine other churches in the "Southeast Hub" of the Northern Waters District and we had the opportunity to meet with D.S. Anita Hahn (for the final time!) to share the victories and the challenges each church, and we as a combined parish face. It was a valuable time. A few of new things happened this year: a soup and pie luncheon put on by the great folks at Merritt, a pie completion that was judged by the Wesley Fellowship (Methodist student fellowship) from Ferris State University, each church was asked to bring information about their community: "Why Would Someone Visit Your Town/Community?," and pastors were asked to select a person from each congregation that is in some way the face of ministry at that church-"Our Best of Show." If you were here on September 23, you helped me select and celebrate the many ways that Darlene Renzema has led and guided us this past year: council chair, parish council secretary, fill-in for a vacancy on the Staff/Parish Relations Committee, member of our Vital Church Initiative "outside team," guide to Janet Goss during her first couple of weeks as our new church secretary, and a go-to help for me as pastor. Darlene is our "Best of Show." Other "BOS" selectees within our parish are AL & Audrey Galloway from Fife Lake, Elwin Hall from South Boardman, and Deb Sieting and Cindy Larson from East Boardman. (After Anita read the names of our selectees, she also reported on what we have done as this new parish experiment and called our parish, her "Best of Show!") Thank you to all who have agreed to serve in leadership roles for the coming year. Your work may seem thankless sometimes but I thank God for you every day.

On a personal note, I want to—once again—thank all of you who have supported me and are continuing to support me, not only as your pastor but also in the fulfillment of a dream—the visit the Holy Land! I realized this weekend that the journey will begin in just a few short weeks. During the journey we will visit I will leave from Grand Rapids on Monday, November 12 arriving in Tel Aviv on the 13th. Capernaum and the Sea of Galilee, then travel to the Jordan River, the several days in and around Jerusalem—the Western Wall, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Via Dolorosa (the path that Jesus probably took to the cross), the so-called Garden Tomb and more. At the end of the regular journey I have the additional opportunity to travel into the southern Jordan mountains, to visit what may be the oldest city in the world, Petra, a city completely built into the red stone walls of the mountains, there. If you ever saw the movie, "Raiders of the Lost Ark," with Harrison Ford, you saw the most famous place in Petra, the treasury, which is shown here. This massive structure is completely contained within the mountain, itself. Following the visit to Petra we will travel to the Dead Sea and then back to Tel Aviv for our journey home, arriving in Grand Rapids on the 24th. Our group, which is being led by Bishop David Bard and his wife Julie, will consist of about 150 persons, traveling in four busses. I look forward to bringing you lots of pictures and many wonderful new discoveries.

During this fall season, I pray that your lives will be richly blessed, that you will find rest in your spirits after the busy summer we have had and renewal of your faith and life in Christ.
